BIOGRAPHY



Dr. Denny Euprasert is a visiting assistant professor of Music at W&L during the 2017-2018 academic year. Dr. Euprasert is the Dean of the Conservatory of Music at Rangsit University, Thailand. He earned a Doctor of Arts degree in Music Theory and Composition with a secondary emphasis in Jazz Pedagogy from University of Northern Colorado, a Master of Music degree in Jazz Studies from University of North Texas, and a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Jazz Piano Performance from Cornish College of the Arts.

As pianist, he has performed with David Liebman, Nicholas Payton, Maria Schneider, Bob Brookmeyer, Deborah Brown, Kenny Wheeler, Mike Stern, Chris Minh Doky, Benny Golson,

Lee Ritenour, Cornish Jazz Orchestra, Bremerton Symphony Orchestra, Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, UNC Jazz Lab Band I, and Bangkok Symphony Orchestra. As conductor, he was appointed the music director and conductor for the 24th Universiade Bangkok and has served as the director for the Ruamsmai Big Band, Thailand Jazz Collective, and Thailand All-Star Jazz Orchestra.

His recording project, "Masterpiece: Asanee-Wason," received the Kom Chad Luek Award for Best Instrumental Album. He is the recipient of the Silpathorn Contemporary Artist Award from the Ministry of Culture of Thailand, one of the country's most prestigious honors in the arts, for his notable contributions to fine arts and culture. His recent CD, Denny Euprasert with Benny Golson and Joris Teepe has received much international recognition.

Recent festival appearances as a leader include headlining at the Bangkok Jazz Festival, the Hua Hin Jazz Festival, the Sawasdee Jazz Festival, Thailand International Jazz Conference, Thailand International Composition Festival, the Taichung Jazz Festival, China Jazz Education Festival. He has served as a jury member and/or guest faculty at numerous national and international music festivals and competitions such as Thailand Jazz Competition, Lebanon Jazz Workshop, Cyprus Jazz Workshop, Shanghai Jazz Summer Camp, and UNISA International Piano Competition.

He has composed numerous works for piano solo, piano and orchestra, chamber groups, chorus, jazz ensemble, voice and piano, and contemporary media.

During his year at W&L, he will direct the University Jazz Ensemble, supervise senior composition recital, teach Theory I and II, Jazz History, and Musical Culture in Southeast Asia.
